HR Careers and Pathways Seminar at Cabrini College

The Workforce Readiness Committee, in conjunction with the College Relations Committee sponsored a Workforce Readiness Seminar entitled "Career Pathways in HR" for college students on November 2 at Cabrini College in Radnor, PA.

Over 20 students from all business majors attended to learn about various career options in HR. Panel speakers included Megan Mulka, MS, PHR, HR Central Information Services Consultant at Pfizer, Sharon Crandall, PHR, Firm Administrator for McBride Shopa & Company and James Kane, MS, SPHR, Director of Continuing Studies at Villanova University. Speakers shared insights into HR technology, recruiting and compensation/benefits career paths.

In addition, to career information, students received advice on networking, certification, advanced degrees as well as finding that first job out of college.

The program allowed the Cabrini students to hear first-hand about opportunities within specific areas of HR. "Many students do not realize the various areas of specialization that are available in the HR profession," stated Mary Bustamante, Workforce Readiness Committee Chairperson. One of the key messages the panel spoke about was for college graduates to be open to all opportunities in the field and to look at each job possibility for the potential learning it can provide to you in your career.

Jim Kane, director of Continuing Studies at Villanova advised students during the seminar that "What companies are looking for are people who understand their business first, and can bring the skills that your HR and business education provided you. You need to know as much about the company's products, services and finances as those who already work there." He also reminded students to "stay positive" in their job searches regardless of current economic conditions.

Overall feedback from the students about the seminar was positive. Erin Tomaszewski, Cabrini Student SHRM Chapter President stated, "The event definitely gave our Cabrini students a better perspective about the different fields of Human Resources and intrigued a lot of interest in the major for undeclared business students. We are very

thankful to Jim, Sharon, and Megan for speaking to us along with Mary and Melissa for all of their hard work to organize the event."

Employee Relations Updates on Temporary Paid Sick Leave Legislation

Workplace safety is a growing concern with the recent outbreaks over the H1N1 illness. Employers are preparing for influenza outbreaks with pandemic training, distributing hand sanitizers and face masks to their employees and teaching basic hand washing techniques. With the continued fear over the H1N1 illness, the proposed legislation, titled the Emergency Influenza Containment Act (H.R. 3991), was recently introduced by House Education and Labor Committee leader Rep. George Miller (D-Cal.) and Workforce Protections Subcommittee leader Rep. Lynn Woolsey (D-Cal.) to the House of Representatives.

The legislation would require employers to provide up to five days of paid sick leave per year to employees affected with H1N1 or a similar contagious illness. The bill applies to employers with 15 or more employees where workers are instructed to go home from work by the employer or stay home from work because of a contagious illness. Employers who offer 5 or more paid sick days will be exempt from this legislation. Employers are prohibited from any retaliation, including terminating and disciplining against employees who comply with the employer's direction to go home and to stay home from work.

House Education and Labor Committee will hold discussions and push for a full vote soon afterwards. And yes, the bill **requires a notice to be posting** (i.e. new labor law poster)!
